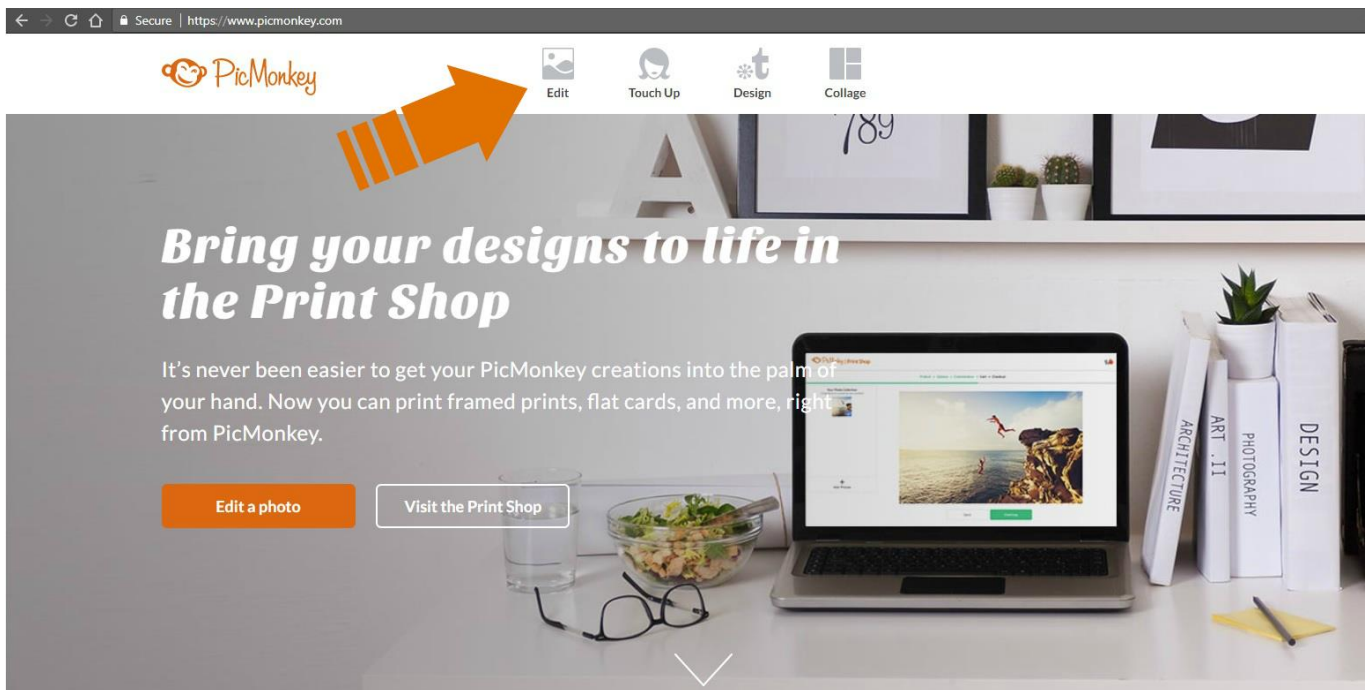


How to posterize an image for Maggie Dillon Designs Textile Collage Technique

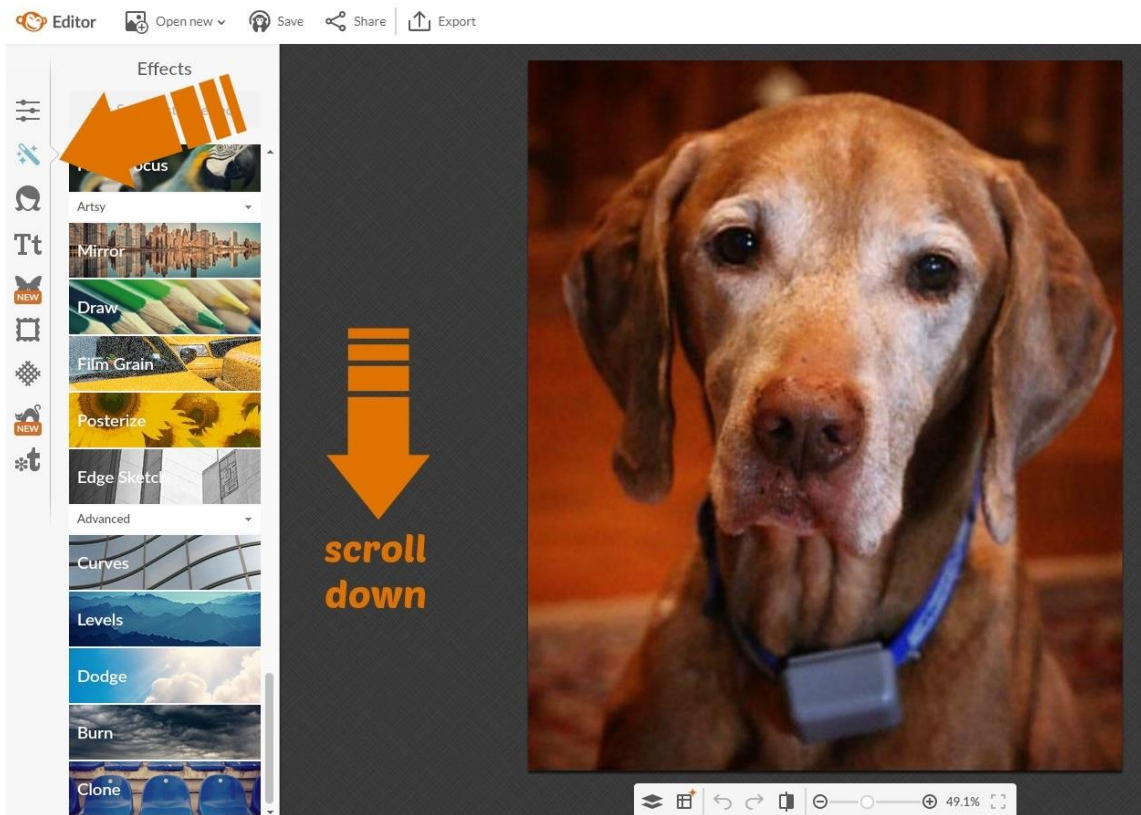
I personally use www.Picmonkey.com to process each image for use in fabric collage.
It is a \$3.99/month subscription. Or, Photoshop has a similar feature.

Today, I will show you how to use Picmonkey.

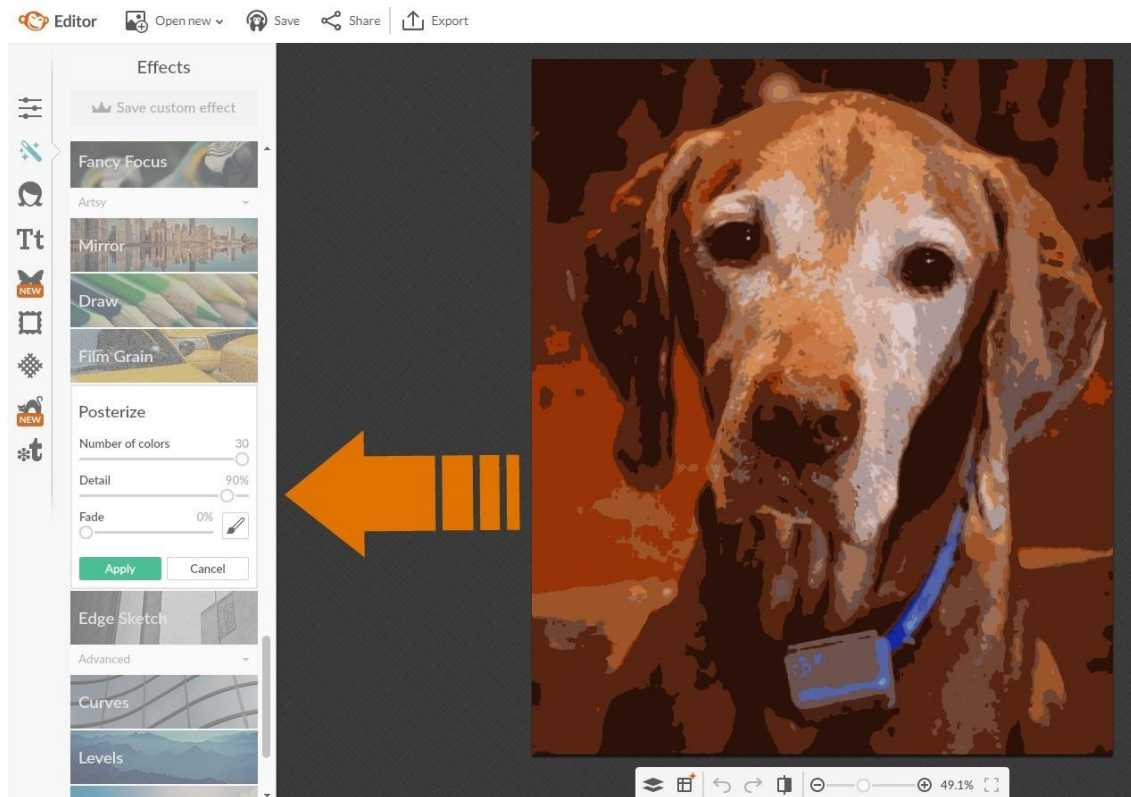
1. Go to www.Picmonkey.com
2. Click EDIT in the top menu.
It will ask you where you want to open the image from (most likely COMPUTER)
3. Select your image and then click OPEN.



**You will see your image appear along with menus down the left side of your screen.



4. Click on the magic wand menu on the left side of the screen. This will open the EFFECTS tab.
5. Scroll almost all the way down and click POSTERIZE.



6. Pull the slider for "NUMBER OF COLORS" all the way to the right until it reads 30.
7. Pull the slider for "DETAIL" to the right so that it is between 80-90 (your preference). Click APPLY.
8. The last step is to click EXPORT from the menu at the top. This saves your image.
